CALLING FOR NOMINATIONS NOW

This year we are again conducting our Project Awards. GWAWA members are asked to put forward nominations for companies who are suitable candidates for these awards.

The categories are:

- DOMESTIC PROJECT UNDER \$20,000
- DOMESTIC PROJECT OVER \$20,000
- COMMERCIAL PROJECT UNDER \$50,000
- COMMERCIAL PROJECT OVER \$50,000
- COMMERCIAL PROJECT OVER \$500,000
- DOMESTIC or COMMERCIAL INTERNAL FITOUT UNDER \$50,000
- DOMESTIC or COMMERCIAL INTERNAL FITOUT OVER \$50,000
- OVERALL COMMERCIAL PROJECT
- BESPOKE GLASS PROJECT UNDER \$10,000
- BESPOKE GLASS PROJECT OVER \$10,000

Nominations should represent a company who has designed, implemented, or installed a glass or aluminium project. The project could be of great volume, complexity or difficulty and must have been completed within the last 12 months.

Nominations are assessed against three criteria, Workmanship / Quality (40% weighting), Technical Excellence (40% weighting), and Design (20% weighting). Refer to the below judging criteria.

Nominations should include the name of the submitting company, the project details, including site details, the individuals involved, and supply of high resolution photos of the project.

The nominations will be assessed by a selection panel and the Winners for each category will be announced at our Awards Night on Saturday, 24th June 2017 to be held at the Rendezvous Hotel, Scarborough

GWAWA - Judging Criteria for all Project Awards 2017 (Linked to the National AGGA Awards criteria)

1. Workmanship / Quality (40%)
 - Accuracy and final finish of work (glass, fixings, frames)
 - Quality of materials used and local content
 - Timeliness, client relationship, variation management

2. Technical Excellence (40%)
 - Use of new products or methods
 - Complexity of the work undertaken–fabrication / processing / fixing
 - Engineering complexity
 - Compliance with standards
 - Safety contribution

3. Design (20%)
 - Aesthetics
 - Innovative use of glass and aluminium

A written response by the judges must be provided against each of the criteria above as well as a score from 1 to 10 based on the following scale for each project nomination:
